
Woodbine Entertainment and their employees are honoured to engage in the sport of horse racing and entertainment activities in the meeting place of Etobicoke and Campbellville.

Woodbine Racetrack is located within the traditional and treaty Land of the Mississaugas of the Credit. Known as Adoobiigok, the "Place of the Alders" in Michi Saagiig language, the region is uniquely situated along the Humber River Watershed, which historically provided an integral connection for Anishinaabe, Haudenosaunee, and Wendat peoples between the Ontario Lakeshore and Lake Simcoe/Georgian Bay regions.

The Woodbine Mohawk Park Racetrack is located within the traditional Lands of the Mississaugas of the Credit of the Anishinaabek Peoples and the Haudenosaunee on whose traditional territory we meet. Mohawk, our namesake, is one of the Haudenosaunee Nations. Kanyen'keha:ka (Mohawk) meaning "the People of the Flint".

Both territories are covered by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, an agreement between the Anishingabe and the Haudenosaunee to peaceably take care of the land and resources around the Great Lakes. Woodbine Entertainment is honoured to care for this land, our human and equine athletes, and provide a place to race responsibly.

Our people, above all else, position us well to take advantage of the opportunities in the years ahead that will build our future and support a vibrant horse racing industry that provides a way of life for tens of thousands of families across our province.

building for the future

Woodbine Entertainment is in the midst of a transformative era with a long-term vision that, at its core, is focused on creating new revenue streams to support the industry and attracting more racing fans out of the millions of people who will visit the property over the coming years. The efforts to bring a train station to the southeast corner of the property remain ongoing and required much focus over the past 12 months. We are hopeful that all our efforts in this regard position us well to get this across the finish line in the coming year.

There are other exciting ventures to note, including the casino, resort, and hotel overlooking the worldrenowned E.P. Taylor Turf Course, a 5,000-seat music venue that will position Woodbine as an ultimate entertainment destination, a proposed soccer facility, and plenty of acreage dedicated to new parklands, greenspace, and affordable housing. As part of these ongoing efforts, our team at Woodbine Entertainment started the process of hiring hundreds of employees who will support our food and beverage operations throughout Woodbine Racetrack and the new casino resort.

We have also made new investments in our own grandstand, including launching the well-received Stella Artois Terrace in July of 2022. The Terrace provides new and existing guests with a premium entertainment and dining experience fully immersed with live Thoroughbred racing, which will no doubt be a major contributor in achieving our strategic goal of attracting a new generation of fans to our sport.

racing

In 2022, we surpassed \$1 billion in wagering handle for the first time in Woodbine Entertainment's storied history, a direct result of our efforts to grow our brand internationally and promoting a product that is ethical, safe, well operated and of the highest caliber.

We were able to operate horse racing this past year in a fully uninterrupted manner. Attendance at both of our racetracks was incredible throughout the season. Operating in our first post-COVID year also saw our first-class food and beverage business grow from a visitation and revenue perspective.

Our Thoroughbred product continued to excel in North America. Our field sizes were near the top of major race meets, and our equine safety record once again placed us at the top of all leading North American Thoroughbred racetracks. Our Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" turf series has become the gold standard for attracting international

Our Standardbred product is the pre-eminent product in North America. Our program is highlighted by premier events such as the Pepsi North America Cup, Mohawk Million, Metro Pace and Canadian Pacing Derby – all names synonymous with the best the sport has to offer.

One of our proudest accomplishments of 2O22 was hosting the two-day Breeders Crown in October. The Breeders Crown (which changes locations each year), is the world championship of Standardbred racing, bringing together all the sports stars for a fabulous weekend of racing to crown champions. Fittingly, our efforts resulted in the largest two-day handle in the event's history. Fittingly, our efforts resulted in the largest two-day handle in the event's history.

On the digital wagering front, we led innovation across North America by introducing artificial intelligence-driven smart picks on HPIBet, two new funding mechanisms for e-transfer, and our new 'Perks Cards' as the replacement to the legacy paper vouchers.

Our Technology and Innovation Team continues its well-deserved mantle as "the very best in the horse racing industry."

The team continued its focus on core enhancements to drive our ability to acquire customers, service existing customers and streamline efficiencies across the enterprise.

On the innovation side, we continued to step-change our digital marketing to engage customers by significantly advancing our content agenda to produce original storytelling that placed our athletes, equine and human, at the forefront. Also, a tip of the cap to our Broadcasting and Simulcasting Team, which is the very best in the horse racing industry.

It is widely acknowledged that our evolution as an organization has relied heavily on "thinking differently" and "being bold." We reengaged our workplace culture consultant to reignite our culture and foster positive energy towards achieving our collective goals. We also partnered with another leading consultant to help us advance our strong commitment to nurture and sustain a holistic culture of diversity, equity, inclusion and belonging.

This past year, we also kickstarted the process of elevating the importance of safety for all our employees and stakeholders across our entire organization. As part of these efforts, we heightened the awareness on health and safety in the workplace for all team members through new corporate and departmental training programs. We are also excited to expand our safety programs in 2023 which will strive towards our Woodbine backstretch community, prioritizing safety procedures and protocols to become the leader in the racing industry.


stronger together

2022 Standardbred racing season at Woodbine Mohawk Park generated a record all-sources handle of \$444,171,816.

The Woodbine Community Plan – our vision to develop our nearly 700 acres of property in Toronto to sustain the horse racing industry in Ontario – will deliver mass transit to the Rexdale community through a privately funded GO Station, build much-needed mixed-use and affordable housing, create 17,000 new jobs, and upgrade our world-class racing and training facilities.

Surpassed \$1 billion in all-sources wagering across Woodbine Racetrack and Woodbine Mohawk Park for the first time in its storied history.

Built and launched our new Stella Artois Terrace to rave reviews, including a 4.9 Google Reviews rating.

Became the first racetrack in North America to partner with the You Can Play Project to make the sport of horse racing more inclusive for all participants.

Planted 170 new trees on the Woodbine property in partnership with the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority and the City of Toronto.

Helped create 1,000 gaming jobs and 250 food δ beverage jobs for the Great Canadian Casino Resort Toronto which opened in Summer of 2023.

Recognized by the International Forum of Aftercare for our work with the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance and LongRun in the care of horses after their racing careers are over.

An increased focus on the health and safety of our team members resulted in a reduction in workplace accidents and lost-time accidents by 60%.

Woodbine Entertainment is the largest horse racing operator in Canada offering world-class horse racing at both Woodbine Racetrack (Toronto) and Woodbine Mohawk Park (Milton).

Woodbine Entertainment also operates off-track wagering through its Champions teletheatre network, which includes Greenwood in the Beaches area of Toronto, and more than 50 Champions locations in third-party establishments.

Remote wagering is also available to customers across Canada online through HPlbet.com, as well as Dark Horse Bets, a revolutionary mobile application featuring advanced artificial intelligence. It is designed to make wagering easier to understand and enjoyable for our next generation of fans.

Woodbine Entertainment also operates HPltv; a CRTC-licensed digital television channel that broadcasts our racing product into homes across Canada.

Woodbine Entertainment is an Ontario corporation, without share capital, operating a multi-dimensional entertainment business committed to maximizing financial performance in order to achieve the highest quality horse racing. After paying all required taxes, the corporation invests any and all profits back into the business to promote its corporate objectives.

How We Do Governance

We are a corporation that reinvests our profits back into the horse racing industry while serving a large employee base in the Province of Ontario. This responsibility of sustaining both an industry and the livelihoods of thousands of people, as well as our focus on our values, drives our decisions and how we operate.


Governance

Responsibility for risk management for the company and compliance oversight with respect to our overall operations rests with our Board of Directors. At the time of publication, the Board is comprised of nine members. Our Chair is independent (not an executive officer), and our Board includes seven committees: Governance and Compliance; Pension; Human Resources and Compensation; Audit; Thoroughbred Racing; Standardbred Racing; and Property Development.

Governance Highlights

Corporate Governance Documentation: We are committed to transparency of our corporate governance. In keeping with this view, we have created a suite of documented governance guidelines and committee charters that are available to review on our website.

Board Membership: We are committed to ensuring that our Board of Directors is composed of members who are best able to position Woodbine Entertainment for the future; therefore, we have policies relating to director competencies as well as term limits on Board positions. Additionally, to attract individuals with skills that would otherwise not be accessible if selection of directors was solely based on industry knowledge, we offer remuneration for Board positions.



supporting mindful wagering

We aim to provide a positive gaming experience at all our venues and for all our customers; however, we understand that a small percentage of people may experience problems related to wagering.

Know When to Take the Reins is our responsible gaming program that ensures we continue to be a responsible corporate citizen and provide a positive gaming experience for all of our customers, at all of our on-track (Woodbine and Woodbine Mohawk Park), off-track (Champions) and digital venues, including on HPIbet.com and Dark Horse Bets (app), where all wagering pages have direct links to the ConnexOntario website, which provides problem gambling services to Ontario residents and is supported by the Responsible Gambling Council (RGC).

This initiative provides individuals with important information regarding safe betting practices, risk factors and signs of problem gambling behaviour, as well as helpful information should someone be concerned about their or someone else's gambling.

taking care of business

- To help customers stay within reasonable wagering limits, we use deposit thresholds when new accounts are created with HPlbet, to ensure that individuals do not deposit excessive funds, these thresholds can only be removed after a certain period of time.
- Additionally, customers can set limits on their own deposits, which cannot be changed until certain conditions are met.
- If attempts are made to deposit funds beyond the deposit limit, the customer will be notified that they have reached their deposit limit and the transaction will be rejected.
- Customers also can place limits on the amount of time spent wagering via functionality available on the HPIbet website.
- Materials about responsible gambling are available to customers throughout all our locations, including on-track and off-track locations, and we have partnered with the RGC and the Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corporation (OLG) to provide PlaySmart, an interactive kiosk and resource centre where, should a racing patron go to the kiosk for support, they are referred to ConnexOntario and/or the RGC.

annual staff training

We ensure that all staff undergo annual training in problem gambling prevention and procedures to assist our customers, and commit to the following:

- Complying with all laws and regulations to provide a safe and secure gambling experience.
- Providing information to customers on responsible gambling.
- Offering assistance to those who may be experiencing problems.
- Promoting responsible gambling policies, practices, and procedures.

Additionally:

- The I8+ rule is strictly enforced, and no minors are allowed to wager at any Woodbine Entertainment racetrack or establishment.
- Woodbine Entertainment is committed to high ethical marketing standards that do not target minors in any way or portray extravagant or misleading wins.
- We aim to increase consultation with the World Lottery Association, an industry authority on the lottery and wagering sector that strives to provide best in class frameworks and policies with respect to responsible gambling. It is important that our growing business is supported in a way that aligns with our commitment to responsible gambling, especially in this new and expanding era of digital wagering.



At the heart of all that Woodbine does is our love of horses. The welfare of our equine athletes has been, and will always be, a top priority. As such, we implement the highest standards for a safe environment for horses.

This, in turn, positions Woodbine Entertainment as an industry leader. We share our best practices not only in Ontario and across Canada, but across North America.

The commitment, focus, resources, and energy we put towards equine health has led to Woodbine Racetrack being one of the safest racetracks in North America.

Other efforts last fiscal year that supported animal welfare and a safe racing environment included:

- Our participation in the review of the Rules of Racing in partnership with the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) and stakeholders across the province to better reflect the current conditions in the areas of safety and integrity.
- Following the Canadian Pari-Mutuel Agency (CPMA) guidelines, which ensures that pari-mutuel betting is conducted in a way that is fair to the public, enforces related regulations and tests horses to deter the use of any prohibited substances through the Equine Drug Control Program.
- Annual accreditation of all racing facilities and surfaces by the National Thoroughbred Association Safety and Integrity Alliance.
- Ongoing collaboration with horse people and veterinary professionals through the Joint Equine Health δ Welfare Committee.
- Ongoing investment in the safety of track surfaces for racing and
- Implementation of an updated Bio-security plan and protocol, in collaboration with AGCO and the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs, to mitigate any equine infectious disease.

At YWS's building in North Etobicoke, clients are given a safe place to sleep, meals, and public transit fare, in addition to individualized counselling services.

After the passing of Queen Elizabeth II, we announced that we would follow tradition and rename the event The King's Plate, following the succession of King Charles III.

Launched our brand-new Stella Artois Terrace, built to attract and serve the next generation of racing fans. With panoramic views of the racetrack and Toronto, live Thoroughbred racing, and an elevated gourmet food and drink menu, the Terrace received rave reviews, including a 4.9 rating on Google Reviews.


In 2022-23, Woodbine Entertainment established a corporate-wide goal to reduce high risk and near miss incidents. Our success in this area focused on timely reporting, early engagement with workers to address accident/incident investigation, and root cause determination with an eye on prevention.


Key Points:

- We invested more financial and people resources than ever before towards health and safety training.
- Roughly 80% of Woodbine's supervisors completed training training that's critical to building an internal responsibility system.
- Areas of training include Health, Safety δ the Law for People Leaders, first aid, equipment training, working at heights, and Joint Health δ Safety Committee certification.
- Every new employee at Woodbine spends 2.5 hours discussing health and safety as part of the company's onboarding program. One hour consists of classroom training, while the remaining 1.5 hours consists of a grandstand walkthrough where the theoretical training is brought to life.

For 2023-24, Woodbine Entertainment is looking to expand its commitment by initiating a Horse Racing Safety Alliance. Working in tandem with the horse racing community, we hope to improve the safety of our horse racing partners who are not employees of Woodbine, but are integral to our sport nonetheless.

tribute to Queen Elizabeth II

The death of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II, on September 8th, 2O22, was a tremendous loss for the world, and one keenly felt by members of the horse racing community. More than just a patron of the sport and horse lover, Queen Elizabeth was an owner who, over her lifetime, actively participated in the breeding of her beloved racehorses.

According to the Queen's long-time bloodstock and racing advisor, John Warren, she had a deep and profound knowledge of breeding thoroughbreds that was developed over decades. She attended four Queen's Plates during her reign. During her final visit to Woodbine in 2010, she met with the owners of the horses competing that day and pulled future Woodbine Entertainment CEO Jim Lawson aside. Lawson recalled to the CBC how they spoke for 15 minutes about his family's history in the sport, as well as horse breeding. He described the experience as one he would "never forget."

Several horses owned by Queen Elizabeth ran at Woodbine. In recent years, Dartmouth, a bay colt, placed second in the Canadian International on October 16, 2016, and her filly Magnetic Charm ran second in the Canadian Stakes on September 14, 2019.

The theme of this corporate report, Honouring Our Past, Building Our Future, draws an obvious parallel with the Royal Family. With the coronation of King Charles, the U.K. and Commonwealth nations are looking ahead to a new era – one that will undoubtedly see change and growth, but one that also pays deference to tradition and history.

Today's Woodbine isn't the Woodbine of yesteryear, but we would not be where we are today without the vision and sacrifice of our founders.

In closing, we thank Her Majesty for her decades of support, and her abiding passion for this sport we hold dear.
