TRAINER: Turf (151.13 \$1.29) Routes (221.14 \$1.24) Stakes (116.12 \$1.45)

- Tiz a Slam displayed talent from the get-go, winning on the Tapeta his debut at age two and becoming a stakes winner later that year in the restricted Cup and Saucer on the turf.
- But the Chiefswood Stable homebred, who went on to finish second in the following year's Queen's Plate and to win the Grade 3 Ontario Derby, can still be defined as something a late-bloomer as he has been in the best consistent form of his career in his recent forays for trainer Roger Attfield.
- "He's a big, big, big horse and still growing," said Attfield. "I think he's just starting to mature now. He can play now, a little bit. He's got some coordination, he never did all his life.'
- Tiz a Slam's recent resurgence has coincided with a take-no-prisoners approach under new rider Steven Bahen. "He has a big, big, big strong stride and he needs to be able to use that stride," said Attfield. "You can't check him in a race and then get him going again. He doesn't have to be on the lead but If he's on the lead, and he's striding well, that's all I want to see."
- And that is exactly what he did see when Tiz a Slam led throughout the Grade 3 Dominion Day on the Tapeta and the Grade 2 Nijinsky on the turf. "He enjoys getting out in a big rhythm and then he just keeps that rhythm up. He doesn't have a really big turn of foot."
- Tiz A Slam made his Grade 1 debut last out in the Northern Dancer and, although he finished sixth, he was beaten just two lengths. He also played a major role in the outcome as he pressed the pace of the favoured English invader Hawkbill, who faltered to finish eighth.
- "He sort of got messed by the speed horse, although I think we got blamed for that horse not running well," said Attfield, alluding to the fact that Hawkbill's rider Jamie Spencer had been unhappy with Tiz a Slam's close attention.
- "We wanted to sit just about a length off that horse, and then that horse started to take us out right from the get-go to the middle of the track, almost going up the hill. Then my horse got on the bridle, and then never really relaxed after that and we were sort of running in tandem, almost, the whole way. We really killed each other, but we killed him more than he killed us. We were just a target for everybody else."

Owner - Chiefswood Stable

Bob Krembil of Toronto and his son Mark are the owners of Chiefswood Stable, which topped the Woodbine standings with almost \$2.2 million in earnings and took home the Sovereign Award as Outstanding Owner last year. Chiefswood, formed in 2002, has a training centre and aftercare facility in Loretto, Ont., and a broodmare facility in nearby Schomberg. Former jockey Rob Landry, now general manager for the outfit, says their overall horse numbers stand at more than 100 including horses of racing age, broodmares, yearlings and weanlings. Their biggest successes to date came with homebreds Niigon (ridden by Landry), who won the 2004 Queen's Plate, and Nipissing, heroine of the 2013 Woodbine Oaks.

Trainer - Roger Attfield

Roger Attfield's Sovereign Award collection is impressive and includes six Canadian Horse of the Year trophies and a record eight Outstanding Trainer awards. Inducted into the Canadian Hall of Fame in 1999, Attfield was further honoured with the announcement of his election to the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame located in Saratoga in 2012. In other Canadian marquee events, the English-born horseman has trained a record-tying eight Queen's Plate winners. Three of them (With Approval, Izvestia and Peteski) went on to win Triple Crowns.

Jockey - Steven Bahen

Steve Bahen's career highlight to date came in the 2002 Queen's Plate, when he guided 82-1 longshot T Js Lucky Moon to victory. Born in Montreal, June 29, 1966, Bahen scored his first career win aboard Micheline, July 7, 1986 at Woodbine. He won his first classic race in 1996, guiding eventual Sovereign Award-winning filly Silent Fleet to victory in the Canadian Oaks. Other career highlights include tallies with John the Magician (1997 Breeders'), Le Cinqueime Essai (Play the King, 2006 and 2007) and Nipissing (2013 Woodbine Oaks).
