- He might only have one win, but Hall of Dreams has also posted four runner-up finishes from seven starts. The chestnut son of Lemon Drop Kid-Hallnor also has a dual hall of fame conditioner and two-time Plate winner in his corner.
- Bred by Joey Gee Thoroughbreds, Hall of Dreams debut last October produced a 10th-place finish. But his next two starts, both second-place finishes, showed trainer Mark Casse the chestnut was on the right track.
- After a disappointing seventh in his second 3-year-old start, the gelding posted another second in his next engagement. One race later, on June 25, Hall of Dreams rallied from well back in a 1 1/8-mile race over the Tapeta to break his maiden. "We purchased him after his second start, and I've always been impressed with him," said Casse. "We bought him with the Queen's Plate in mind. When he broke his maiden, he was very impressive."
- In his first stakes test, the 1 1/8-mile Plate Trial, the sophomore once again finished with flourish, grabbing the place award behind stablemate Sir for Sure, another Casse trainee who will contest the Queen's Plate. "He ran really well. There was some stuff that happened at the top of the lane with Sir for Sure, and looking at it, I thought it could have gone either way. If they had taken him down, I wouldn't have been shocked. He had a bit of a troubled trip, but the good news is that the extra eighth of a mile won't hurt his feelings."
- "He doesn't draw attention to himself. Horses either draw attention to themselves in one of two ways: they can be really bad or really good. He's just kind of there, but he gets the job done."

Former MGM executive Gary Barber is the co-founder of Spyglass Entertainment and CEO of Spyglass Media. Spyglass Entertainment produced such motion pictures as "Seabiscuit" (nominated for seven Academy Awards), "Memoirs of a Geisha" (won three Academy Awards), "The Insider" (nominated for seven Academy Awards) and "The Sixth Sense" (nominated for six Academy Awards). Barber has served as executive producer of more than 50 films. The South Africa native has owned Thoroughbreds alone and in partnership with his brother Cecil and others. Notable horses include In Lingerie, Cost of Freedom, Comma to the Top, Jack Milton, Appealing Tale and 2015 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf winner Catch a Glimpse. Tourist won the Breeders' Cup Mile in 2016 for a partnership that included Barber. He won two Canadian classic races in 2018 with Wonder Gadot. Channel Maker earned a Grade 1 win in the Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Stakes in 2018 for Barber and partners Wachtel Stable, R. A. Hill Stable, and Reeves Thoroughbred Racing. War of Will in 2019 won both the Lecomte Stakes and Risen Star Stakes at Fair Grounds. He ran a troubled seventh in the Kentucky Derby but bounced back to post a dominant victory in the Preakness. Barber added another Breeders' Cup win when Belvoir Bay scored a front-running win in the Turf Sprint. Adam Wachtel is the son of New York owner and breeder Edwin Wachtel. Wachtel Stable spreads its horses among several trainers. Wachtel joined Brous Stable to race multiple graded stakes winner Al Khali and partnered with both Barber and Brous Stable to race Grade 1 winner Sharla Rae and Grade 2 winner Tiz Shea D. Adding Jack Hammer, Wachtel Stable, Barber and Brous Stable also raced Grade 1 winner Ron the Greek. Wachtel had interests in multiple graded stakes winners Exaggerator, Long on Value and Bolo. Peter Deutsch won his first graded stakes when Take Charge Paula took the Forward Gal Stakes (G3) in 2018. Deutsch, CEO of Deutsch Family Wine & Spirits, purchased his first stakes winner, Adirondack Summer, for \$38,000 at the 2009 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale. Leonard Schleifer cofounded drugmaker Regeneron in 1988, and is CEO of the Tarrytown, New York company.

Jockey – Patrick Husbands

Patrick Husbands has been a force at Woodbine since 1994. Born in Barbados where he started his career, Husbands comes from a riding family. His father was a rider while brother Simon also rides. In 1990, at age 16, Husbands became the youngest rider to win the Cockspur Cup. He also won the Bajan riding title in 1993. Top horses he guided to victory during Canadian Horses of the Year campaigns include Lexie Lou (2014), Sealy Hill (2007) and Triple Crown champ Wando (2003). Husbands has a record eight Sovereign Awards as Outstanding Jockey, the most recent coming in 2014 in which he won his seventh Woodbine riding title. A two-time Queen's Plate winner (Wando in 2003, Lexie Lou in 2014), Husbands, named the 2014 recipient of the Avelino Gomez Memorial Award, has over 3,500 career victories and earnings in excess of \$172 million (U.S.).
