



TRAINER: Turf/Dirt (50 .26 \$1.19) Route/Sprint (66 .18 \$1.35) 31-60Days (531 .30 \$1.75) Dirt (539 .25 \$1.35) Sprint (375 .23 \$1.43) Stakes (481 .26 \$1.89)

- Supplemented to the Ricoh Woodbine Mile for \$20,000, Made You Look, a five-year-old son of More Than Ready, heads into Saturday's turf classic off a pair of graded engagements at Saratoga, namely, the Grade 3 Forbidden Apple (fourth, on July 12), and the Grade 1 Fourstardave Handicap (fifth, on August 10).
- Owned by Three Chimneys Farm and trained by Chad Brown, Made You Look has four wins, two seconds and a third from 14 lifetime starts. The highlights, to date, are victories in the Grade 2 With Anticipation Stakes (2016) and the Grade 3 Dania Beach Stakes (2017). He also contested the 2016 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, finishing sixth to last year's Woodbine Mile champ Oscar Performance.
- In three starts last year, the dark bay recorded a win, a second and a fourth. The runner-up effort came in the Grade 3 Poker Stakes in June, where Made You Look settled for place honours in a race won by Oscar Performance.
- This will be Made You Look's second appearance at the Toronto oval. Two years ago, he was fourth to Yorkton in the one-mile Charlie Barley Stakes.
- Bred in Kentucky by The Robert and Beverly Lewis Trust, Made You Look was produced from the Unbridled's Song mare Night and Day, a daughter of the Hall of Fame filly Serena's Song.
- A \$360,000 yearling purchase at the Keeneland September Sale, Made You Look finished second in his first start to the talented filly Red Lodge, but broke his maiden handily in his next start.

Three Chimneys Farm is based in Midway, Kentucky and was established in 1972 by Robert N. Clay and his wife, Blythe. The highly prominent outfit has been home to a number of famous horses including U.S. Triple Crown champion Seattle Slew, U.S. Filly Triple Crown champion Chris Evert, as well as Kentucky Derby winners Genuine Risk, Silver Charm, Smartly Jones and Big Brown. Brazil's Goncalo Borges Torrealba purchased a controlling interest in Three Chimneys in the fall of 2013 and the outfit has continued to thrive. The most recent Three Chimney blockbuster was 2017 U.S. Horse of the Year Gun Runner, whom they campaigned in partnership and now heads their stallion roster that also includes Grade 1 stakes winner Funtastic, who competed here in last year's Pattison Canadian International.

Chad Brown, who learned the racetrack ropes with trainer Shug McGaughey, moved on to work as an assistant to the late Bobby Frankel for five years when the stable's stars included the likes of Ghostzapper, Intercontinental, Empire Maker and Medaglia d'Oro. Brown saddled his first winner on his own account on November 23, 2007. His rise since then has been nothing short of meteoric and the 40-year-old Brown now is riding the crest of three consecutive Eclipse Awards as Outstanding Trainer. He recently captured his third Saratoga training title, following a record 46 victories last year. In 2018, Brown saddled the top two finishers in the Grade 1 Arlington Million after fielding the top three in the Grade 1 Beverly D. at that oval that same afternoon. He dominated Arlington Million Day again this year when winning four stakes including the Arlington Million, Beverly D., and Grade 1 Secretariat. Brown runners have been particularly dominant in grass racing with his Eclipse Award winners in turf racing including Flintshire, Lady Eli, Big Blue Kitten and Stacelita.

Born in Mexico City, Luis Contreras began his career in Mexico at age 16 and rode more than 100 winners in four consecutive seasons before moving to Golden Gate in Northern California. Since coming to Woodbine in 2009, with riding for Steve Asmussen then his primary impetus, Contreras has won three riding titles from 2011 to 2013 and back-to-back Sovereign Awards as Outstanding Jockey in the first of those seasons. He won the Queen's Plate with Inglorious in his first try, and then took the Prince of Wales and Breeders' Stakes with Pender Harbour to become the first rider to win all three Canadian Triple Crown races with different horses. In 2017, Contreras took the first two Triple Crown legs with

champion Holy Helena and the John Ross trainee Cool Catomine. He also finished second in last year’s Queen’s Plate aboard 28-1 Aheadbyacentury and was the runner-up with Amis Gizmo (2016) and Ami’s Holiday (2014).
