

Race 1

#4 Awesome Grace

#5 Clockwork Angel

#3 Lovely Rainbow

#1 Swifty Kim

#4 AWESOME GRACE makes her fourth start here. She is capable of showing speed but on a couple of occasions has been chasing pacesetters who have simply been better than her; if none of the first timers here are special she may be able to come out on top. #5 CLOCKWORK ANGEL is by 8% juvenile debut sire Hard Spun, and is the first foal to start out of an unraced Shaman Ghost mare. The worktab is not impressive; likely spotted properly for the tag in her debut. #3 LOVELY RAINBOW is by 7-for-55 juvenile debut sire Tamarkuz, out of a mare who has had two winners in four foals to start, neither of which won at two. She has had a couple of quick gate works. #1 SWIFTY KIM for the most part has not been breezing as quickly as her stablemate. Souper Speedy is a 12% juvenile debut sire; all three of the dam's foals to start are winners, though just one of them won at two.

Race 2

#3 APELDOORN raced off of the inside while chasing a bias-aided winner, flattening out to be fourth when last racing on June 14. He drops in for a tag for the first time and will shed the blinkers. #4 PADDY HOLIDAY ran a credible fourth when debuting in a 6 ½ furlong sprint three weeks ago. He adds blinkers and could be the controlling speed with the stretch out in distance. #7 WHO GOES THERE has raced against biases in his two most recent starts, racing well two-back before regressing against maiden allowance company on July 4. He gets back into the OS/\$40,000 level and could rebound. #6 TONY FROM ANGUS had a good inside trip on June 14 but was outfinished by Who Goes There for the place spot. He makes his second start off of the bench here; definitely a contender.

Race 3

#2 SAKPE is by 9% juvenile debut sire Authentic, and is a half-brother to debut-winner Shak Town, who has won over this course and distance. The works look steady. #3 BUDDHA'S DELIGHT is by 9% juvenile debut sire Temple City, out of a multiple Stakes-winning mare who has produced Sweet Fusion, who was multiple Stakes-placed at two. The majority of the works on the page have been recorded as handily, which may be a turn off to some. #5 CATTRALL is by first-crop sire Corniche,

who is off to a hot start as a sire with four debut winners in 14 starters. Unraced dam has had one winner in three foals to start. #1 LOGAN'S THUNDER is by 13% juvenile debut sire Frosted, and is the first foal to start out of an unraced Candy Ride mare. A \$90,000 purchase at the local sale, she has had a couple of fairly quick gate breezes.

Race 4

#1 COWBOY had a three-wide uncovered trip in his debut three weeks ago over the inner turf, making a bid turning for home but being outkicked by the eventual winner and flattening out to be fourth. He draws inside this time and could build on that first effort. #3 MISTER BLUE has been setting fast fractions and weakening in deep stretch this season. His breeding suggests the route distance should not be a problem, and he may find the more moderate pace easier to sustain. #4 WEMBLEY AVENUE made a swooping move to the lead on the far turn but weakened late, getting run down near the wire. Graded 3-placed colt looks like an obvious contender here. #6 BUIUM swung wide and rallied belatedly to be third on the inner turf, 3 ¼ lengths better than Cowboy on July 5. He definitely has some ability but his plodding running style seems to get the better of him.

Race 5

#7 KOOL KAROLINE is by 16% debut sire Not This Time, and is the second foal to race out of a mare whose other runner has been a low-level claiming winner. The worktab looks solid and this field does not look out of reach. #4 TAP THIS WAY was a vet scratch when set to make her local debut on July 4 and now returns to the entries. She showed some speed before faltering when racing in the slop at Gulfstream in May; looks like she has been breezing well on the turf. #5 SCOTCH MIST was a bit rank when kicking off her season on June 13. She was scratched from an off-turf race for \$40,000 last week and now returns; she showed some ability last year and I think she will improve from that disappointing seasonal debut. #2 MARY GOODNIGHT rallied from last to be third behind classy UK import Majaz when kicking off her season in the aforementioned June 13 race. She looks like an obvious contender but may be overbet for a horse who is prone to falling far back early.

Race 6

#4 SOUPER DIVA has finished second in all three of her starts this season, digging back in to regain second behind the perfectly tripped Souper Sporty on the turf last time in the Georgian Bay. A multiple Stakes-winner at 6 ½ furlongs last year, I think she will appreciate finally getting out past 5 and 5 ½ furlongs. #7 SPLASH OF BOURBON exits back-to-back wins in OS/\$40,000 conditioned races, prevailing at the wire to hold off Tequilasoupernova in a non-three 15 days ago. She definitely seems to have taken a step forward this year and is an obvious contender for the red-hot Sid Attard outfit. #8 ARTFUL DIAMOND had some minor trouble going into the turn but ran on well enough when fifth in the Georgian Bay. A \$25,000 winner on the Tapeta last year, she could hit the ticket at an okay price in her second start off of the bench. #2 SOUPER SPORTY had a perfect trip when pulling off an 18-1 upset in the Georgian Bay over the inner turf. Although a winner on the Tapeta it does not seem to be a surface she loves; I wouldn't take too short a price in this bid to double up.

Race 7

#6 HE'S NOT JOKING had a very wide trip when making his turf debut in a very tough Gulfstream allowance in February. That race has produced two Stakes-winners and several others who have won allowances or high level claimers since. This colt ran a decent race behind some quality foes like Wyoming Bill in May and could definitely be worth a look getting back to turf in a more reasonable spot. #3 KEKOA finished up very nicely when second behind Itsastormymonday over this course on June 7, then came back with a comfortable rail-rallying win in an off-turf race on July 4. Restricted Stakes-winner should not have a problem with the move up to the N2X/\$50,000 level. #7 SCORCHING battled while racing three-wide and emptied out when favoured in a 5 ½ furlong dash on May 30. He gets on turf for the first time since being placed first in the 2024 Cup and Saucer. #8 ITSASTORMYMONDAY was allowed an easy lead and was never headed when winning an N1X/\$32,000 over this course on June 7. He is unlikely to get things his own way as easily this time.

Race 8

#10 WINE AFTER WHISKEY battled for the lead and had the advantage turning for home but was outkicked by the perfectly-tripped Duckduckduck when trying turf in the Lake Huron. He was so impressive in his seasonal debut and could notch his first Stakes-win getting back to the Tapeta. #3 PEPPER BROOKS debuts here after initially being entered in a maiden special weight on a card that was cancelled due to the poor air quality. The half-brother to Patches O'Houlihan has likely shown some promise if this was the direction they decide to reroute towards; certainly intriguing. #6 DUCKDUCKDUCK was flat in his seasonal debut on May 16 but got back to form when winning the Lake Huron. The Clarendon winner last year will not have an issue with the return to the Tapeta; major player. #2 TIHO SRCE has raced well in both of his starts to date and has the potential to land a very good inside stalking trip; I could definitely see him hitting the ticket at an okay price.

Race 9

#10 NOBURU won his seasonal debut against OS/\$40,000 maidens, then took on some very tough multiple winners in an N1X/\$32,000 on June 14, drawing the 10 hole and getting stuck wide and a very inside/speed biased surface and finishing last. Unfortunately he draws 10 again, but if he can work out a trip he has a big shot to rebound with the return to easier company. #2 RUNNER EYES has raced very well in both of his starts for these connections, adding blinkers and racing wide last time en route to a runner-up finish. He draws well here and looks like a main contender. #3 DECADENT DANISH had a rough break last time but ran on well to be fifth, 2 ¼ lengths behind Runner Eyes last time. He has not run a bad race thus far in his career and looks like he's in with a shot here. #7 DELTA FORCE was claimed for this tag from his maiden win on June 12. 1-for-1 on the turf, we'll see if he can do it again getting into slightly deeper waters. #4 THOR'S CAUSE had a wide trip when kicking off his season in the same July 6 race that Runner Eyes and Decadent Danish exit. He had a nice runner-up finish over this course in August last year and could hit the ticket at a price.
