#8 Armada Rising (IRE)

#1 Chargethatmountain

#2 Hobbie Class

#7 Take Chances

#8 ARMADA RISING (IRE) was a non-factor when making her seasonal debut against N1X/\$32,000 company on June 6. Purchased for just \$4,000 in the Fasig Tipton June Digital Sale after that race, she plunges all the way in for \$7,500; raced well in her only previous synthetic try in her career debut over the Dundalk Polytrack. #1 CHARGETHATMOUNTAIN was fractious in the paddock and raced evenly when trying the Fort Erie dirt 24 days ago. She finished second for \$15,000 in her first start for these connections and drops back in for the price she was taken for. #2 HOBBIE CLASS had to swing wide to get out of traffic and failed to launch a serious rally on July 9, but could fare better in her second start after a year off. #7 TAKE CHANCES ran a credible third in a route when kicking off her season on July 5 and cuts back in distance for her second start of the year.

#3 SCARY SPEEDY battled on the lead and was second best to Silicium on the inner turf three weeks ago. She could be the controlling speed here. #5 SILICIUM (FR) was able to rally up the inside to win over the inner turf over Scary Speedy three weeks ago. A four-time winner in eight starts, she has had success on the Gulfstream Tapeta and should be in with a good shot again. #4 MRS. C was beaten two lengths for place when finishing fifth behind the runaway Mobula on July 18. She drops down from the OS/\$40,000 level for her third start off of the layoff. #1 AVA'S PRINCESS looks to double up after an easy win against non-twos on the drop in for this tag on July 10.

#3 MO'SPRESSO kicks off his season here for a red-hot barn. Gelded son of Uncle Mo did not fare well in two tries against winners late last year and is now tagged for the first time, but that does not seem like a red-flag considering he was once raced (and beaten) at Fort Erie, signifying they haven't considered him top quality stock. #6 MY COVENANT ran a good third behind Lean Music Machine at this level on June 28. He hasn't run a bad race to date in his career and looks competitive once again. #4 WILD CARD had a great inside stalking trip, took the lead in the stretch but could not hold off the closing Bowman's Run when beaten a half-length on the inner turf last time. Aside from a troubled trip on May 23 he has been racing very well this year; logical contender. #2 PARADISE PERFECT did not have a great trip racing against a bias two-back, but finished up very well when fifth by just 1 ¼ lengths in the same inner turf race that Wild Card exits. His running style makes winning difficult but he shows up for a check often.

#8 VEERY battled on the lead before giving way to be third on the inner turf at this level on July 5. 12-time winner is the class of this field and should be tough if she can make the early lead. #6 SO KATE had a very good trip and looked good in her debut win, then put in a good effort despite never truly looking like a win threat when fifth in the Alywow. Daughter of Uncle Mo gets out to a route now and catches a field with several other non-twos. #4 TALENT SHOW takes a shot at a higher level after an easy starter allowance score on July 11. Her starter allowance rival Purrfect Girl recently won against \$25,000 company last week, and it's not unheard of for good starter allowance horses who know how to win to step up to the N1X category and fare well. #2 TALBOT'S RIPLYN was an even fourth, 3 ¾ lengths behind Veery when making her turf debut on July 5. She may simply be better on the Tapeta.

#3 PROPHETIC DEBBY (IRE) did not get to save much ground when making her turf debut in an N2L allowance on July 11. She drops in for \$40,000 and should be tough if she can get covered on the inside. #4 MIKELLE makes her first start since coming up empty in an N2L allowance over the Tapeta on May 30. Although her maiden win came on the Tapeta her best speed figures have come in turf routes; gets class relief for her first start in two months. #1 LADY IZZY has had two good runner-up finishes in as many starts this year, last time leading late before getting run down by the closing Vrana. She draws inside and figures to be competitive despite the rise from the \$25,000 level. #5 NORTH YORK was never given a breather when battling on the front end but found enough to prove best when breaking her maiden for this tag on June 11; could get loose on the lead this time.

#1 TOO MANY AMYS had a bizarre trip where she looked like she was going to be pulled up turning for home but found her stride again and re rallied on June 20. There's clearly some run in her; we'll see what happens this time. #4 CRUMLIN FASHION ducked in at the gap after the start and never got involved when kicking off her season at the OS/\$40,000 level on June 6. She plunges in for \$15,000 and has shown that she is capable of better. #2 CAN'T ARGUE THAT debuted for \$10,000 on June 25, rallying to be third behind two next-out winners and is definitely in with a shot in her second attempt. #6 BEAU PINK was disappointing as the even money favourite when dropping in for \$10,000 and attracting a claim on July 5. We'll see if she can return to form for the new connections.

#4 LADY MOONSHINE was finishing up well when sixth in her seasonal debut on June 11, missing place by 1 ¾ lengths. A vet scratch on July 9, she looks live in this return. #6 CRUMLIN TROUBLE was pressed early but took control of the tempo before coming up second best to Naughty Destiny on July 9. She could be the controlling speed in this spot. #5 STERLING HEIGHTS was 1 ¼ lengths behind Crumlin Trouble when rallying from the back to be third last time. Both of her efforts since coming off of lasix have been solid; in with a shot. #1 MOVENTOTHECOUNTRY had a pretty easy lead but could not fend off Amazin Queen when routing 11 days ago. She ran a decent third at this distance three back.

#4 BELIEVE IN LUCK drops in for \$10,000 after lacking any serious finish against \$25,000 foes on July 4. The barn was off to a slow start but has started to gain momentum; this one should be live with the class drop. #3 SPORTY ANGELA is by 12% debut sire Old Forester. The worktab looks unsurprisingly unimpressive; this barn has had a couple of good results with cheaper debut runners at the meet. #1 MISS CANDY GIRL ran a decent second when making her local debut for this price on June 5, holding the place spot from next-out winner Ryo Amazing. #2 FEATHERWEIGHT threw in a clunker when making her seasonal debut on July 9, her first start in nearly 11 months. She had some good results last year; we'll see. #7 DUCKSFLYTOGETHER has a long steady string of works coming into her debut here. Souper Speedy is a 12% debut sire; best of luck to trainer Shawn Lawson with his first Woodbine starter.
